As I look back on the 2022-2023 fiscal year, I see so many reasons to praise and bless God. They include but are not limited to:


- Welcoming visitors almost every Sunday.


In Building | We had a total of 1601 people worship in the building. Our average weekly attendance was 36.


New Communication Methods

Weekly Email | We updated our weekly email to be more visually appealing and to provide more information at a glance. Over 100 people receive the email each week.


Instagram | We joined Instagram as @stpeterunitedchurchofchrist to help us reach more people – especially younger folks who prefer this platform.








Our bell choir continued under the direction of Alice Grubb. There were 14 ringers who played several times for worship services & special events.




We celebrated Jesus' birth with a candlelight Christmas Eve service.



Engage


Everyone uses their gifts consistently to help our church thrive.



Feed My Starving Children


We delivered over 20 baskets of food to Joanie's Closet which were delivered to local families, including many Ukrainian refugees, to enjoy for Thanksgiving.

Pastor Ruth led 10 Lake Zurich Girl Scouts (4 of whom are part of the St. Peter community) in faith-based activities during the My Faith, My Promise Workshop.





The Piecemakers celebrated 10 years of quilting to support women and children fleeing domestic abuse. During their decade together, they have sewn almost 1,500 handmade quilts and too-many-to-count hand-tied fleece blankets and other handmade items.

VBS Mission Project

This year, VBS kids, their families, and members of the St. Peter community donated items to be shared with families facing natural disasters, violence, or grinding poverty. We collected enough items and monetary donations to make 47 hygiene kits – that's over 300 individual items!

Christian Education



The Women's Book group of about ten ladies continued to meet weekly. They discussed two more of the *Sensible Shoes* book series and *The Sacred Pulse* by April Fiet.

Our Daily Bread

Our Daily Bread quarterly devotionals were made available for personal quiet time.

Compassion Discussion Group

Many joined a January/February discussion group with conversation loosely based on *Living Compassion: Loving Like Jesus* by Andrew Dreitcer.

Listening Lab

In the spring, many participated in Listening Lab, a 4-week program where participants from middle schoolers through adults learned a new listening skill each week and practiced it together in groups.





We had 21 kids join us as Knights of North Castle at VBS this summer. They learned how to armor up with truth, justice, peace, faith, and God's strength during our time together. We had lots of help from the congregation who purchased/let us borrow items; volunteers who helped decorate; and those who led our stations & groups each day. Seven teens and eight adults helped run VBS.

Kids' Sunday School

20 K-5th graders participated in Sunday School. We had 3 kids in Confirmation class (grades 6-8) and 3 second graders received Bibles through our SteppingStones program.
